

**National Changhua University of Education**  
**Notes for Application for Scholarships and Grants**  
**for Needy Overseas Chinese Students**

Established on June 24, 2004  
Revised on September 5, 2006

- I. These points have been established pursuant to Paragraph I of Article 6 of the 「Important Points of Grants for Poor Overseas Chinese Students of Senior Secondary Schools or Above」 issued by the Ministry of Education.
- II. These points have been established in order to fairly, justly, and objectively review the family financial situation and academic and conduct performance of poor overseas Chinese students and to implement a system of support for Needy overseas Chinese students that work hard to complete their studies on schedule.
- III. Application requirements for grants for poor overseas Chinese students:
- (I) Overseas Chinese students whose family has difficult financial conditions that are studying in Taiwan pursuant to the regulations for overseas Chinese students' coming back home for studying and tutorship (excludes graduate students, delayed graduates, and self-supported students from Myanmar).
  - (II) Students' parents, statutory guardians, or spouses have had a registered residence in Taiwan for no more than two years.
  - (III) Students' parents have settled in Taiwan and meet the conditions for exemption of comprehensive income tax of the previous year after verification, and they possess the relevant documentation.
  - (IV) For applicants in their sophomore year or above, their academic achievement for the entire previous academic year shall have an acceptable average, and their conduct achievement shall be at least 80 points on average.
- IV. Principles of the grants:
- (I) Quota determination:
    - 1. The allocation quota for the general area and poor region shall be calculated pursuant to the ratio set forth by the Ministry of Education.
    - 2. The allocation quota for freshman shall always be 20%; sophomores, juniors, and seniors shall have their quotas determined as mentioned above.
  - (II) Grant amounts: The grants shall be paid monthly pursuant to the amount stipulated by the Ministry of Education; the validity of all grant allocations shall be one year (from September to August of the following year). Recent graduates shall only be paid through June of the following year.
  - (III) The grant shall be revoked from those who quit school or drop out once verified. Those students with a demerit recorded or expelled shall have their grants revoked starting in the following month once verified by the school.
  - (IV) Overseas Chinese students who lie or provide false certificates, their grant shall no longer be paid, and any grant money that they have already received will be recovered.
- V. Application process:
- (I) Within two weeks from the beginning of the registered first semester of each academic year, overseas Chinese students shall complete the application form (Attachment I), attach to it the proof of poverty and transcript (excluding overseas Chinese freshman students), and submit all documents to the Students Assistance Group in order to file an application.
  - (II) Overseas Chinese students transferring from another school shall also provide the school transfer certificate and their achievement records for the previous academic year.
- VI. Review process:
- (I) The school's review group for grants for poor overseas Chinese students consists of seven members: the dean of Student Affairs, the leader of the Students Assistance Group, undertaker

responsible person and the chairman of the Overseas Chinese Federation, a representative of poor overseas Chinese students of each region, etc. The 「Integral Statistical Table of Grants for Poor Overseas Chinese Students」 (Attachment II) shall be completed based on the application form filled in by the students for evaluation and review; the academic year review task shall be completed prior to October 25 each year, with the review records kept for future reference.

(II) Review standards:

1. The review group shall determine the 「Minimum Poverty Integral」 for the convenience of reviewing the poverty grants.
2. Freshmen applicants shall be ranked in accordance with the poverty integral in the integral statistical table, while applicants in their sophomore year or above shall be ranked according to aggregate score in the integral statistical table. Students with the same score shall be ranked pursuant to the items in the 「Integral Statistical Table of Grants for Poor Overseas Chinese Students」.
3. The review group shall adjust the quota range within the principles of each year as necessary.

(III) The family's financial situation and proof of poverty provided by the overseas Chinese students may be submitted to the Overseas Chinese Affairs Commission for verification when necessary.

(IV) Those students who meet the requirements upon being reviewed by the school be listed according to grade order, and a regional application proportion table shall be attached, and both shall be submitted to the Ministry of Education for verification.

VII. The applications to allocate, use, cancel after verification, and report funds shall be handled pursuant to the regulations for review, allocation, and report of the Ministry of Education's grants and commissioned funds.

VIII. These important notes for review procedures shall be signed and approved by the president, and the same shall apply to any revisions.
