### Admission Requirements

1. 3.0 GPA in last 60 units/ Transcripts/
2. Interview/ Writing Competency/ Personal
3. Statement/ 3 Letters of Rec
4. Submit a 5-page writing sample in English that the MA coordinator would review. The coordinator can grant special consideration to waive the CBEST, and undergrad writing requirement.

## ATTACHMENT B

### FRESNO STATE ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT

In addition to meeting all other admission requirements outlined in Attachment A, NCUE students must fulfill the English language requirement for admission in one of the following:

- 1) a score of 83 on the Internet Based TOEFL (iBT);
- 2) a band score of 6.5 on the IELTS; or,
- 3) a written waiver by the academic department.

**Remarks**

**SPED 243 has an embedded graduate writing requirement** for the students from NCUE to fulfill as a Master's degree requirement.

**Assignments that involve direct work with K-12 school age students** will be adapted based on NCUE students' abilities to obtain the appropriate background clearance to work in schools (e.g., LiveScan, TB tests, etc.)

Students would only **complete projects, with the stipulation that these cannot involve human subjects within the K-12 schools.**

Admission of each cohort of NCUE students will be capped at 4 unless otherwise agreed upon by the Department of Literacy, Early, Bilingual & Special Education.
